

Our Mission

The mission of The CIRI Foundation (TCF) is to promote individual self-development and economic self-sufficiency through education and to maintain pride in culture and heritage among Alaska Natives.

The CIRI Foundation supports the education and career development of eligible original enrollees of Cook Inlet Region Inc. (CIRI) and their direct lineal descendants through post-secondary scholarships and grants. Individuals with inherited or gifted shares do not qualify as original enrollees, but may be eligible if they are a lineal descendant.

GENERAL SEMESTER SCHOLARSHIPS

For full-time, degree-seeking students. Up to \$2,500 per semester/term*

Application deadlines:

June 1 December 1

CAREER UPGRADE GRANTS

For part-time, degree-seeking students. Up to \$4,500 per calendar year*

Application deadlines:

March 31 September 30
June 30 December 1

VOCATIONAL TRAINING GRANTS

For students in vocational training or certificate programs. Up to \$4,500 per calendar year*

Application deadlines:

March 31 September 30
June 30 December 1

* All scholarship and grant amounts are subject to available funding.

APPLICATION CHECKLIST:

Applications must be received on or before the deadline. Applications received after the deadline are not considered.

- 1. **Three-Page Application.** The complete, signed, and dated three-page scholarship and grant application provided by The CIRI Foundation. If you are submitting a web application, an original signature on page three is still required.
- 2a. **Proof of Eligibility for Lineal Descendants.** (*New Applicants Only*) Lineal descendants of original CIRI enrollees must provide the relevant documents to confirm their relationship. (e.g. official birth certificate(s) or adoption decree linking you to the original enrollee.) More than one birth certificate may be necessary. *Sworn statements or affidavits are not accepted as official verification of eligibility.*
 - If you are eligible for a village scholarship/grant through Ninilchik Native Association, Inc., Salamatof Native Association, Inc., Tyonek Native Corporation/Native Village of Tyonek or Eklutna, Inc, please include an official written statement or enrollment cards from your village corporation.
- 2b. **Proof of Name Change.** Any legal name changes must be supported by official documentation (i.e. marriage certificate, divorce decree, etc). *Sworn statements or affidavits are not accepted to verify name changes.*
- 3. **Letter of Reference.** Letters must include the signature, date and contact information of the individual who provided the reference (non-family members, please); and are valid for three years.
- 4. **Official Grade Transcripts and/or Certificate of Completion.** Submit a copy of your official transcripts/certificates for the most current coursework completed. Your cumulative GPA must be 2.5 or above to be eligible for funding. If you have been out of school five (5) or more years, also submit a paragraph explaining your learning experiences and work achievements during that period of time. **Note:** Official grade transcripts are signed by the school's registrar and/or have an official seal from the school.
- 5. **Statement of Purpose.** Attach a written statement of purpose. Complete instructions regarding the Statement of Purpose are on Page 2, Section F. Your statement is evaluated for clarity of goals, correct use of English language, relationship to community, and overall quality.
- 6. **Proof of Acceptance/Enrollment.** Scholarship applicants must submit a copy of the letter of acceptance into an associate, bachelor, or graduate degree program **and** proof of registration for the term (i.e. class schedule.) If you are applying for a vocational training program that requires payment upon registration, proof of **Intent to Register** from the school may be submitted to fulfill this requirement.
- 7. **Photograph.** (optional) Please note that your photograph becomes the property of TCF and may be used in print and electronic TCF Publications. Digital photos may be emailed to tcf@thecirifoundation.org.

SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM ELIGIBILITY

The CIRI Foundation Scholarship program is open to original enrollees of CIRI and the direct lineal descendants (either natural-born or legally adopted) of original enrollees of CIRI. Individuals who have inherited or received gifted shares do not qualify as original enrollees. All scholarships are made subject to available funding and up to the amounts listed below.

Scholarship applicants are:

- **Students accepted or enrolled full-time in a degree-seeking program at an accredited or recognized institution. Full-time enrollment is taking at least twelve (12) undergraduate credit hours, nine (9) graduate credit hours during a semester/term/quarter, or as defined by your institution.**

If you are enrolled in a certificate program or part-time in a degree-seeking program, please see the Grant Program Eligibility and deadlines (next page).

GENERAL SEMESTER SCHOLARSHIPS

Purpose: Merit scholarships for applicants with academic promise.

Requirements: Must have a high school diploma or GED and be accepted or enrolled full-time in a 2-year or a 4-year undergraduate or graduate degree program. Applicants must have a cumulative 2.5 GPA or better.

Amount: Up to \$2,500 per semester

Duration: One semester. A student may receive no more than two (2) general semester scholarships during the academic year.

Deadlines: June 1 for the Fall term and December 1 for the Winter/Spring term

ACHIEVEMENT ANNUAL SCHOLARSHIPS

Purpose: Merit scholarships for applicants with exceptional academic promise.

Requirements: Must have a high school diploma or GED and be accepted or enrolled full-time in a 4-year undergraduate degree or graduate degree program. Applicants must have a cumulative 3.0 GPA or better to be considered.

Amount: Up to \$8,000

Duration: One academic year

Deadline: June 1, only

EXCELLENCE ANNUAL SCHOLARSHIPS

Purpose: Merit scholarships for outstanding academic and community service experience.

Requirements: Must have a high school diploma or GED and be accepted or enrolled full-time in a 4-year undergraduate degree or graduate degree program. Applicants must have a cumulative 3.5 GPA or better to be considered.

Amount: Up to \$10,000

Duration: One academic year

Deadline: June 1, only

SPECIAL EXCELLENCE ANNUAL SCHOLARSHIP

Purpose: Merit scholarship for exceptional academic experience and outstanding community service.

Requirements: Must have a high school diploma or GED and be accepted or enrolled full-time in a 4-year undergraduate or graduate degree program. Applicants must have a cumulative 3.7 GPA or better. Preference is given to the fields of business, education, math, sciences, health services, and engineering. *This award is made at the discretion of the Education Awards Committee.*

Amount: Up to \$20,000

Duration: One academic year

Deadline: June 1, only

DEADLINES

Applications must be **received by** The CIRI Foundation on or before the deadline to receive consideration. Late applications will not be considered. The stated deadline remains in effect whether the day falls on a weekend or a holiday. Submit your application **before** the start date of your coursework. Courses completed before the application deadline are not eligible for funding.

Applicants are considered for the appropriate award category based on their submitted information. [Please note – the annual scholarship awards are highly competitive.](#) All applications meeting the requirements for an annual scholarship award are considered. You cannot apply, specifically, for an annual award.

SCHOLARSHIP AWARD USES

The priority of The CIRI Foundation is to help you meet your direct educational expenses including tuition, student registration fees, course-required books/supplies, and on-campus housing/meal plans. If funds remain after the direct educational expenses are met, then up to \$500 per scholarship award may be released to the student for personal expenses.

GRANT PROGRAM ELIGIBILITY

The CIRI Foundation Grant program is open to original enrollees of CIRI and the direct lineal descendants (either natural-born or legally adopted) of original enrollees of CIRI. Individuals who have inherited or received gifted shares do not qualify as original enrollees. All grants are made subject to available funding and up to the amounts listed below.

Grant applicants are:

- **Students enrolled part-time in degree-seeking program taking 11 or fewer undergraduate credit hours or 8 or fewer graduate credit hours during a semester/term/quarter at an accredited or recognized institution <<OR>>**
- **Students enrolled part-time or full-time in a vocational training or technical skills program at an accredited or recognized institution for which a certificate of completion is earned.**

If you are currently enrolled full-time in a degree-seeking program, please see the Scholarship Program Eligibility and deadlines (previous page).

VOCATIONAL TRAINING GRANTS

Purpose: To promote preparation for successful careers in a specialized technical skills field.

Eligibility: Must be accepted or enrolled part- or full-time in a technical skills certificate or vocational training program. Should have a high school diploma or GED; must maintain at least a 2.5 grade point average; and must be prepared to demonstrate the availability of employment upon completion of the training.

Amount: Up to \$4,500 received during a calendar year.

Duration: May re-apply each quarter of a calendar year until the grant cap is reached. May re-apply the following calendar year after grant cap has been reached.

Deadlines: March 31, June 30, September 30, December 1

CAREER UPGRADE GRANTS

Purpose: To encourage employment skills upgrades or re-entry into the job market to achieve improved job status through promotion or success in securing employment.

Eligibility: Must be accepted or enrolled part-time in a course of study that directly contributes toward potential employment or employment upgrade. Total credit hours must be 11 or fewer undergraduate credit hours or 8 or fewer graduate credit hours. Should have a high school diploma or GED; must maintain at least a 2.5 grade point average.

Amount: Up to \$4,500 received during a calendar year.

Duration: May re-apply each quarter of a calendar year until the grant cap is reached. May re-apply the following calendar year after grant cap has been reached.

Deadlines: March 31, June 30, September 30, December 1

DEADLINES

Applications must be **received by** The CIRI Foundation on or before the deadline to receive consideration. Late applications will not be considered. The stated deadline remains in effect whether the day falls on a weekend or a holiday. Submit your application **before** the start date of your coursework. Courses completed before the application deadline are not eligible for funding.

When TCF receives more eligible applications than the available funding, meeting the minimum selection criteria does not guarantee funding at any level. Applicants are considered for the appropriate award category based on their submitted information.

GRANT AWARD USES

The priority of The CIRI Foundation is to help you meet your direct educational expenses including tuition, student registration fees, course-required books/supplies, and on-campus housing/meal plans. If funds remain after the direct educational expenses are met, then up to \$500 per calendar year may be released to the student for personal expenses.

SCORING AND SELECTION CRITERIA

All applications are considered for the appropriate funding categories based on information you provide in your application. During the selection process, all applications are scored and ranked based on the following criteria:

1. Application is submitted on-time and before the deadline
2. Application is complete
3. Cumulative GPA meets the minimum 2.5 requirement
4. Rigor of coursework/degree program (2-yr, 4-yr, Graduate)
5. Grade level (Freshman, Sophomore, Junior, Senior, Graduate, Certificate)
6. Personal financial contribution
7. Financial need
8. Employment preparation (Does the degree program directly relate to career goals?)
9. Statement of purpose (Clarity of career goal, correct grammar, giving back relationship to community, and overall quality)
10. Extent of community involvement and in volunteer/civic activities

The annual scholarship awards are highly competitive and meeting the GPA requirement is only part of the selection process. Other factors considered in the selection of annual scholarship awards include an exceptional statement of purpose with a clear articulation of education and career goals, a high level of community service and civic activities, and a demonstrated intent to give back to community and Alaska.

NOTIFICATION OF FUNDING DECISIONS

The CIRI Foundation's Education Awards Committee makes the award selections and all decisions are final. Funding decisions are only released in writing; they are not released over the telephone or in person. Funded students are sent an award letter that contains the award terms and the responsibilities of the recipient. It is essential that award recipients read and understand the terms of their financial aid.

INFRACTION PROVISION POLICY/ENROLLMENT CHANGES

Award recipients are required to complete all courses and credits for which they are funded and maintain a cumulative GPA of 2.5 or higher on a 4.0 scale. In general, enrollment changes that are made within the add/drop period at your institution are permissible. However, schedule changes made after the add/drop period that reduce the overall credit load may result in an infraction. There is no penalty for completing more credits or classes than those listed on your application. Please send written notification of any enrollment or schedule changes to TCF. **Students in an infraction situation will be ineligible to apply to The CIRI Foundation for two (2) award deadlines from the date of determination. The date of determination is based on when TCF is notified of the infraction.**

CONDITIONAL AWARDS

If you receive a conditional scholarship, grant, or fellowship award, you have thirty (30) days from the date on the conditional award letter to fulfill the award requirements. Funds will be released only if the requested information is provided to The CIRI Foundation by the conditional award deadline. If an application remains incomplete after the conditional award deadline, the award is automatically canceled.

DISBURSEMENT OF FUNDS

Award checks are made payable to both the student and the university/school, and must be endorsed by both parties to be processed. Award checks are sent directly to the financial aid office at the institution specified on your application. Students are sent a photocopy of the disbursement letter that accompanies the award check. To avoid unnecessary delay in the receipt of your financial aid, please provide accurate payment information on your application. If your educational program requires a different payment procedure (i.e. payable to school only, online program), please indicate on the application (line #13).

PROOF OF COMPLETION

Scholarship and grant recipients must submit final official grade transcripts or certificates upon the completion of each semester/term of funding. Proof of completion must be received before any additional funds will be released or future applications can be considered.

NUMBER OF AWARDS

An applicant is permitted to receive only one (1) award at a time and no more than two (2) general semester scholarship awards per academic year or the maximum amount of grant funding in a calendar year.

DESIGNATED ENDOWMENTS AND NAMED FUNDS

In addition to scholarships and grants awarded from The CIRI Foundation General Endowment, TCF also manages several designated endowments and named funds. These funds were established by community members to celebrate individuals and recognize specific accomplishments.

Eligible applicants are original enrollees of CIRI and the direct lineal descendants (either natural-born or legally adopted) of original enrollees of CIRI. Inherited or gifted shares do not qualify as original enrollment. Awards from the designated endowments and named funds are only considered at the deadlines specified below.

Applications received at the appropriate deadlines that meet the eligibility requirements will be considered for awards through the designated endowments and named funds.

ALL DESIGNATED ENDOWMENT AND NAMED FUND AWARDS ARE SUBJECT TO AVAILABLE FUNDING.

JOHN N. COLBERG ENDOWMENT SCHOLARSHIP FUND

Established in memoriam by CIRI, Sally Berlin and Frank Saracoff, Peter and Evelyn Hocson, and Robert and Kathy Woodhead to encourage students pursuing the study of law.

Eligibility: Preference for undergraduate degree or graduate degree students enrolled in the study of law. Should have a cumulative 2.5 GPA or better.

Deadline: June 1, only

ROY M. HUHNDORF ENDOWMENT SCHOLARSHIP FUND

Established by Southcentral Foundation in 1995 to encourage students seeking an undergraduate degree or graduate degree particularly in health services.

Eligibility: Preference is given to students enrolled in health fields.

Deadlines: June 1 and December 1

PETER KALIFORNSKY MEMORIAL ENDOWMENT SCHOLARSHIP FUND

Established by CIRI in 1993 to encourage students enrolled in Alaska Native studies.

Eligibility: Preference is given to students enrolled in Alaska Native studies.

Deadlines: June 1 and December 1

KECK/WESTMIN ENDOWMENT SCHOLARSHIP FUND

Established by Howard Keck and Westmin, Ltd. to encourage undergraduate or graduate degree in all fields.

Deadlines: June 1 and December 1

CARL H. MARRS SCHOLARSHIP FUND

Established in recognition of Carl H. Marrs in 2001 to encourage students seeking an undergraduate or graduate degree in business administration, economics, finance, organizational management,

accounting or similar fields. Funds provided by Barbara Donatelli, Craig and Thea Floerchinger, Mark and Leslie Kroloff, Kirk McGee, and Gloria O'Neill.

Deadline: June 1, only

LAWRENCE MATSON MEMORIAL ENDOWMENT SCHOLARSHIP FUND

Established by Cook Inlet Region, Inc. in 1989 to provide merit scholarships.

Eligibility: Preference is given to students enrolled in liberal arts fields – language, education, social sciences, arts, communications, and law

Deadlines: June 1 and December 1

Established by CIRI in memory of George Miller, Jr. in 1996 to foster improvement of tribal, cultural and corporate management skills for career advancement.

Eligibility: Must be a business leader of demonstrated outstanding ability and potential to improve tribal, cultural and business leadership and management skills for career advancement.

Amount: Up to \$6,000.

Duration: One year. May apply once during the calendar year.

Special features: The Fellowship is for organizational management courses of study, internships or specialized or general management or organizational training programs.

Deadlines: June 1 or December 1

NINILCHIK NATIVE ASSOCIATION, INC. (NNAI) SCHOLARSHIP AND GRANT PROGRAM

Established in 1992 by the Ninilchik Native Association, Inc. to offer merit-based scholarships.

Eligibility: Original enrollees of NNAI and their direct lineal descendants. Must be accepted or enrolled full-time in an undergraduate or graduate degree program or technical skills training program. For tuition, required fees, books, on-campus-related room, and meal plan and for other direct school related costs. Should have a cumulative 2.5 grade point average or better.

Duration: One semester. Must re-apply each semester.

Deadline: June 1 and December 1 for scholarships, June 30 for grants

SALAMATOF NATIVE ASSOCIATION, INC. (SNAI) SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM

Established in 1992 by the Salamatof Native Association, Inc. to offer merit scholarships.

Eligibility: Original enrollees of SNAI, their direct lineal descendants, and spouses. Must be accepted or enrolled full-time in an undergraduate or graduate degree program or technical skills training program. For tuition, required fees, books, on-campus-related room, and meal plan and for other direct school related costs. Should have a cumulative 2.5 grade point average or better.

Duration: Annual. Applicants apply only one time during the year.

Deadline: June 1

TYONEK NATIVE CORPORATION SCHOLARSHIP (TNC/NVT) AND GRANT PROGRAM*

Established by the Tyonek Native Corporation in 1989 to encourage professional preparation for careers after high school.

Eligibility: Original enrollees of TNC, their direct lineal descendants, and tribal members of the Native Village of Tyonek (NVT). Must be accepted or enrolled full-time in an accredited or otherwise approved post-secondary college, university, or technical skills education program. Must have a cumulative grade point average of 2.0 or better.

Duration: Scholarship applicants must re-apply each semester. Grant applicants may re-apply each deadline of a calendar year until the funding cap is reached and may re-apply the following calendar year after grant cap has been reached.

Deadline: March 31*
